



GROUP MEETINGS. These always have interesting speakers and are a good opportunity to meet your fellow family historians. The venue details are on the website www.eastsurreyfhs.org.uk and in the Journal.


SUTTON – Thursday 2nd June 2016 at 7.45pm. Dr Judy Hill will speak on 'Agricultural Unrest and the Swing riots in Surrey'.

Although the local gentry were often sympathetic the government's Special Commissions were savage and hanged nine men and transported nearly 500 others. It was insisted that Swing had its roots deep in hunger and oppression which would be remedied only by parliamentary reform.



SOUTHWARK - Monday 13th June 2016 at 12 noon. We will hear about using railway and other records to investigate railway ancestors. 'Mayhem on the Midland {an Accident, a Suicide, and a Murder}' from Chris and Judy Rouse.

This originated as a brief report to the Board of Trade, and which concerned an accident which occurred on Wednesday 8th December 1847 on the Midland Counties Line, in the early days of rail travel, involving the wife of Lord Zetland and her maid Emily Jeffs whilst travelling in their own private carriage on the train. One




point made was that the plight of Emily Jeffs, who remained largely anonymous in early accounts, would probably never have come to light if it had not been for the prominence and persistence of her employers.

RICHMOND – There is no June meeting. The next meeting is on **Saturday 9th July 2016** when Michael Page will tell us about *'The Most Wretched Man in the World'*, The life and loves of the 5th Viscount Midleton.

Hear all about the short but eventful life of George Brodrick (1806-1848) who married scandalously, patronized the great Catholic architect Augustus Pugin for his seat at Peper Harrow, Godalming, saw his Irish estates ravaged by the potato famine and met a miserable end.

CROYDON – The next meeting is on **Tuesday 18th June 2016 at 7.45pm**. Lindsay Ould is the Borough Archivist based at Croydon Museum. She will give an insight into what records are held in the Croydon Archive **'Unseen Archives'**.





Southwark Group Visit to Crossbones Graveyard


The FFHS has launched a competition aimed at children and young people aged between 5-16 years.

- Write a short paragraph (no more than 450 words) describing what they enjoyed most about working on the booklet.








When you open the Memorial photos they will initially appear small and illegible! It is possible to read the names clearly however, you just have to enlarge the image by 'stretching' it by spreading your fingers on the Touchpad (or using whatever the 'Zoom View' capability is on your computer.)

The US Social Security Death Index (SSDI) (From Dick Eastman's blog 13 May 2016) <https://blog.eogn.com/>

The Social Security Death Index (often called the SSDI) lists deceased people within the United States. When first created, the SSDI only listed those people who were receiving Social Security benefit payments at the time of death. However, as the years went by, the database was expanded to include **ALMOST ALL DEATHS**, whether receiving benefits or not.

The Social Security Administration (SSA) Death Master File (DMF) contains more than 80 million records of deaths that have been reported to SSA. This file includes the following information on each deceased person, as applicable: name, date of birth, date of death, state or country of residence (prior to Mar 1988), and ZIP code of last residence.

The Social Security Administration stopped releasing updates to the SSDI a few years ago, however, the original database, current through to January 2011, remains in the public domain and is still available online from a number of web sites. Later deaths are not publicly listed, however. Try:

Notes:

In most cases, only the first ten letters of each individual's first name are shown in the SSDI. For instance, the name "Christopher" is abbreviated as "Christophe". Also, middle initials are shown, but complete middle names are not recorded in the database. Entering all the letters of first names with more than ten letters sometimes results in a "not found" error so best to use only ten letters.

We recently received this update from Surrey History Centre:

'SURREY LAND TAX 1780-1832 AND MORE - NOW ONLINE'

'Over 2 million more records can now be searched online on the family history website [Ancestry.co.uk](https://www.ancestry.co.uk): Surrey Land Tax Returns 1780-1832; Surrey Licensed Victuallers Registers 1785-1903; and Surrey Jury-Qualified Freeholders and Copyholders Lists 1696-1824.

These new record sets were all kept by Surrey's Clerk of the Peace. At a time when political rights were far more restricted, he used the Land Tax returns to work out who should have the vote in elections and also kept lists of property holders so properly qualified juries could be appointed. Rowdy or unlicensed drinking houses were as much a concern in the 18th and 19th centuries as they are now and it was the Clerk's responsibility to keep lists of those innkeepers who had been approved by the local magistrates.

You can search for your Surrey ancestors on Ancestry free of charge at any Surrey Library and at Surrey History Centre in Woking. If you have an Ancestry subscription, you can also view the records in the comfort of your own home, no matter where you live!

Over 2 million Church of England baptism, marriage and burial records dating back to 1538 are already available to search; as well as over 10 million Electoral Register entries 1918-1945. Look out for 100,000 early parish register records which have also now been added.

Other records to appear online soon are: Electoral registers 1832-1915; Brookwood Hospital Woking, Registers of Admissions 1867-1900; Holloway Sanatorium, General Registers 1885-1899; Calendars of prisoners: Surrey Sessions and Assizes 1848-1902; Queen's Royal West Surrey Regiment enlistment registers 1920-1946; Queen's Royal West Surrey Regiment transfers in registers 1939-1947; Queen's Royal West Surrey Regiment World War II Honours Indexes [1939]-1946; East Surrey Regiment enlistment registers 1920-1946; East Surrey Regiment transfers in registers 1924-1946; and 21st - 24th Battalions the London Regiment Nominal Rolls of Officers 1914-1919.'

British Library – India Office <http://indiafamily.bl.uk/ui/Home.aspx>

The India Office records, which include those of the East India Company, are held in the British Library, **NOT at TNA.**

Use this website to search:

- 300,000 births, baptisms, marriages, deaths and burials in the India Office Records
- biographical notes from a variety of sources
- for mainly British and European people in India c.1600-1949
- for people in other countries connected with the history of the British in India



The India Office Records

The India Office is the custodian of the archives of:

- East India Company (1600-1858)
- Board of Control (1784-1858)
- India Office (1858-1947)
- Burma Office (1937-1948)

The India Office Records collections contain much information of great interest to family historians, **mainly relating to European and Eurasian people**. There are biographical sources for official and non-official inhabitants of the many [overseas areas](#) (CTRL and Click for the live page) where the East India Company and India Office had influence, and also for home staff based in Britain.



The records include details for:

- civil servants
- military personnel
- mariners
- medical staff
- chaplains
- railway workers
- law officers
- non-official inhabitants such as merchants and planters, free mariners, and missionaries.

Where does the information on this site come from?

The main sources are: (For each heading below Press CTRL and click for full details):

- [Returns of baptisms, marriages and burials](#) (Records of these events for European and Eurasian Christians in India and in other places)
- [Military Department records](#) These include records of officers' appointment to the armies of the East India Company
- [Marine Department records](#). These include records of service for officers and seamen in the East India Company's maritime service.
- [Accountant-General's Department records](#) These include records of army officers contributing to the Madras Military Fund

Addiscombe Military Seminary	The East India Company's Military Seminary was established in January 1809 at Addiscombe Place, near Croydon. Its purpose was to provide up to two years' general and technical education for youths of between fourteen and eighteen who had been nominated for officer cadships in the Company's forces. Attendance at Addiscombe was compulsory for artillery and engineer cadets, optional for cavalry and infantry cadets. After the demise of the Company in 1858, Addiscombe was converted into the Royal India Military College and continued to function till its closure in August 1861.
